

2012 Schedule for Meetings of the Depression Glass Club of Greater Rochester

Each Meeting this year will cover a different Color of glass that was produced during the Depression Era.

- January 26 – **Snow White** – Some companies called their white color Opal, Alabaster or Vitrock, but mostly we just know it as Milk Glass. We'll learn about the various companies that produced many popular patterns in White – bring your favorite pieces to share.. *If weather is bad, please call ahead to Museum Security at 732-2164. Renewal of dues \$7 must be paid.*
- February 23 – **Think Pink** – Or LaRosa, Cheriglo, or Flamingo. We'll learn which companies used these names to market their pink glass. Bring your favorites to share with the group. *If weather is bad, please call ahead to Museum Security at 732-2164. Renewal of dues \$7 must be paid.*
- March 22 – **Green with Envy** – There are a lot of shades of green to be envious of; from Stigel Green to Moongleam and from Emerald to Jade. Bring your favorites to share and make us all jealous. **Business:** Nomination of Officers **PLEASE NOTE: DUES MUST BE PAID BY MARCH 31 TO REMAIN AN ACTIVE MEMBER. You will not be allowed to rejoin until 2013.**
- April 26 – **Mellow Yellow** – Yellow was a very popular glass color during the depression; it invoked sunshine and happy times with names such as Canary, Seville and Topaz. Bring your favorite piece of 'sunshine' to brighten our meeting. **Business: Election of Officers**
- May 24 – **Purple Passion** – There's Amethyst, Burgundy, Lilac and those charming dichroic colors Twilight, Wisteria and Alexandrite. We'll learn more about one of the most popular color families of the time. Bring your pieces to share. **Business: Picnic Signups**
- June 14 **Club Picnic** at Buckland Park on Westfall Road; details to follow.
- July 26 – **True Blue** – Most people think of Cobalt, but do you know who made blues called Seville, Willow, Azure and Ritz? Bring your favorites to share. **Show Display Preview:** Last year's winner Margaret Lawson shares her idea "Days of Wine and Roses" with us. Displays will consist of a minimum of 4 pieces – a vase (full of roses, of course), 2 wine glasses and a serving piece such as a bonbon or cheese and cracker.. **Business: show and display sign-ups.**
- August 23 – **Simply Red** - or Ruby, Carmen and even Spanish Red; we'll learn what makes Ruby glass an all time favorite, and why the color is hard to keep consistent. Bring your favorite pieces to share. **Business: Show sign-ups.**
- September 6 - **Crystal Clear** - All crystal glass is not created equal; find out why some "crystal" is more clear than others – some of our glass could even be considered "Lead Crystal".
